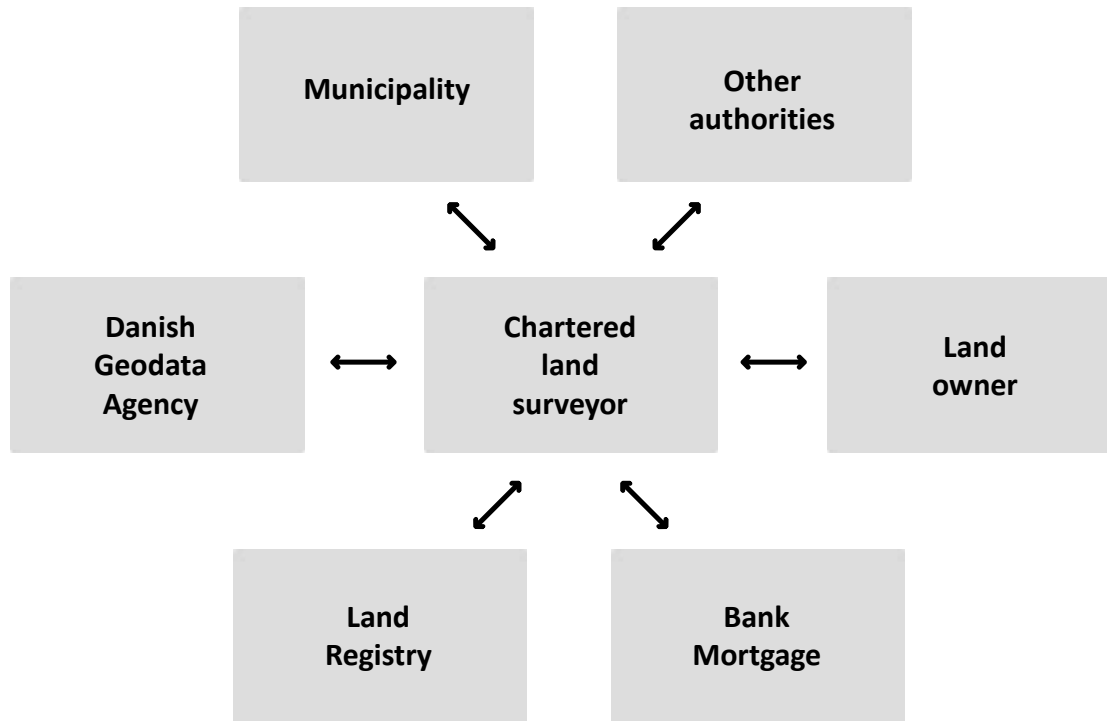

- Extensive use of private sector

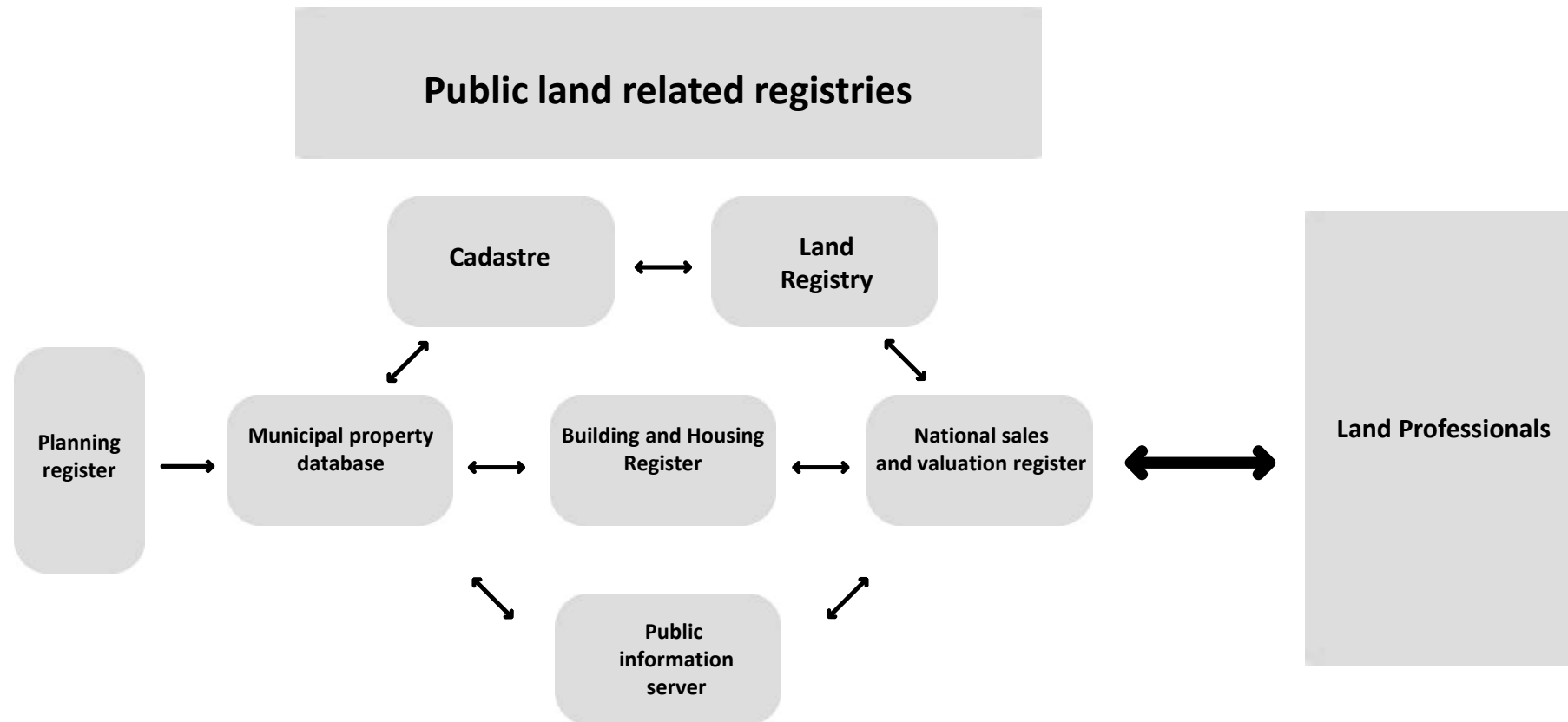


PPP in cadastral proceedings and IT systems

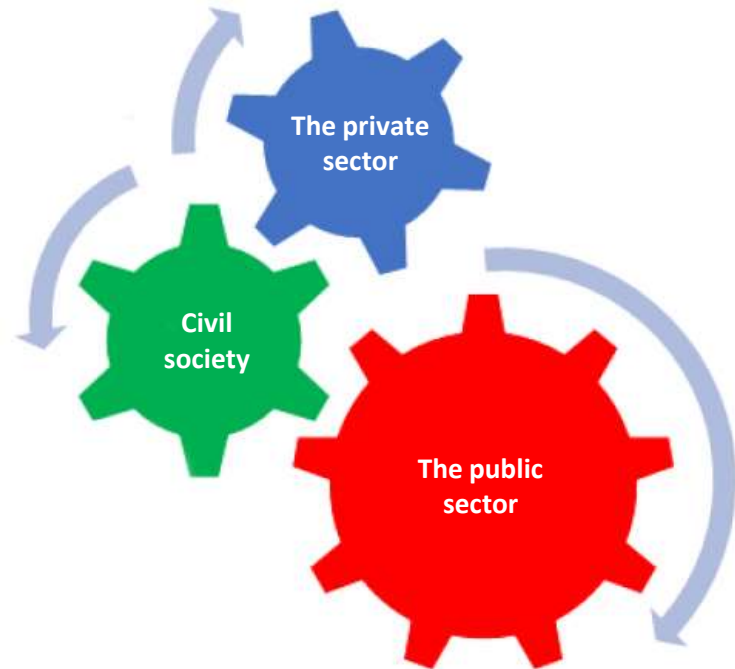
- Determine policies and maintain control
